Five Teams Sent. Five Teams Qualified. Baybridge Sweeps to Global Round.

Fifteen students take on 82 teams from 14 schools — and come home with the round's top individual honour, three subject championships, and a 100% qualification rate.

SUBJECT TITLES

Fifteen Baybridge students — drawn from across year groups and working as one family — lined up against some of the largest schools in Tanzania. Haven of Peace Academy brought 13 teams. The Feza network brought nearly 40. Baybridge brought 5.

Laamia NoorAli was awarded the **Jac Khor Award**, the highest individual honour at the round, and was named the 2nd Champion Scholar in the entire Junior division. She topped three of the five subject areas — History, Literature & Media, and Science & Technology — not just among juniors, but across both divisions, outscoring every senior scholar in the building.

Maia Chandarana finished as the 8th Champion Scholar and 4th in the Individual Challenge, winning the Special Area subject title. **Arhaan Ladak** placed as the 10th best in the Individual Challenge. Their team — alongside **Pinto Pinto** — won the Team Bowl outright: 1st place, beating every team in the Junior division.

Every student who represented Baybridge came home with placements across multiple events. Two teams competed as pairs against full teams of three — and qualified regardless. There were no passengers.

"Our teams were mixed across year groups — older students working alongside and looking after younger ones. This is the Baybridge family in action."
